Professor Alastair Mullis is a graduate of King's College London (LLB, 1984) and Downing College Cambridge (LLM, 1985).

Professional Experience:

After graduating from Cambridge and spending a year teaching at the University of Nottingham, Professor Mullis become an investment manager with a major UK investment management company. In 1989, he decided to return to academia and taught at King's College London from 1989 - 1999, where in 1996 he was appointed senior lecturer. He joined the Norwich Law School in 1999 and became Dean in September 2001. As well as holding a chair at the Norwich Law School, Professor Mullis has been a visiting professor at several US law schools and currently is a visiting professor at two universities in Germany (the Universities of Muenster and Trier) and a visiting Research Professor in international commercial law at the Faculte des Sciences Juridiques, Tunis.

His main research and teaching interests lie in the areas of international commercial law, media law and tort law. He is the general editor of Carter-Ruck on Libel and Privacy and the author of books on the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods and the law of torts. He has written many articles on these and other subjects. His published work is frequently referred to in international arbitrations and has also been cited in judgments by common law superior courts

Professor Mullis has a particular interest in international legal education and he has worked on a number of legal reform projects with the British government and the Law Society in Egypt, Tunisia, Morocco and most recently Libya.
